

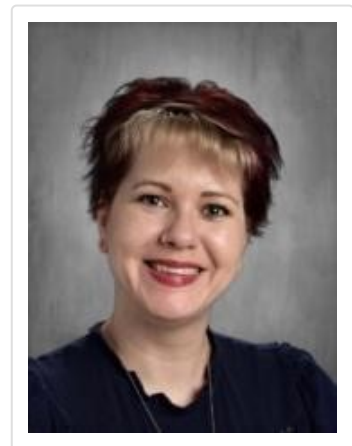

Skills to Help You Soar

Happy New Year to everyone! My name is Ms. Bonogofski and I am an Inclusion Learning Teacher (ILT) at Eagle Butte. I work with students for a variety of reasons and provide supports to students in a number of ways. My goal is to help ensure all students can be successful at EBHS. One area that can be critical to success is developing strong executive functioning skills.



What is executive functioning?

Executive function skills allow us to set and achieve goals. They are necessary to help us function effectively in everyday life. Executive functioning includes the skills that enable individuals to manage and prioritize information and tasks. These skills are essential for managing time, staying on task, completing assignments, and controlling impulses... all of which are important aspects of school.

How do these skills benefit my teen?

Teens need executive functioning skills because they are at a critical developmental stage in which they are transitioning from childhood to adulthood. During this time, they face many new and complex challenges, such as navigating high school's social and academic demands, making decisions about their future, and managing their own time and responsibilities. Additionally, as teens develop their sense of self and identity, good executive functioning skills can help them manage their emotions and impulses, which is essential for healthy relationships and decision-making. Furthermore, good executive functioning skills in teens are closely linked to academic and occupational success and overall mental and physical health.

How can I support the development of executive functioning skills in my child?

We use these skills at every stage of life, and while no one is born with these skills, we all have the potential to develop them. Parents can support their children in developing executive functioning skills in several ways:

- **Encourage planning and organization:** Help your teen set goals and develop a plan for achieving them. Encourage them to use tools such as a calendar, to-do list, or a planner

to keep track of their tasks and deadlines.

- **Promote time management:** Teach your teen how to prioritize tasks and manage their time effectively. Encourage them to break down large tasks into smaller, manageable steps.
- **Model good decision-making:** Encourage your teen to think critically about their choices and help them weigh the pros and cons of different options. Show them how to make decisions based on their values and long-term goals.
- **Provide opportunities for physical activity:** Regular physical activity can help teens develop inhibitory control, working memory, and cognitive flexibility.
- **Support their learning:** Be involved in your child's education, encourage them to take on challenging tasks, and help them to develop good study habits.
- **Be aware of potential issues:** Be mindful of any potential issues that might affect your child's executive functioning skills, such as ADHD, and seek professional help when necessary.

What role do I play?

It's important to remember that every child is unique and develops at their own pace. While some children may struggle with certain executive functioning skills, parents can play an important role in helping their children develop and improve these skills over time.

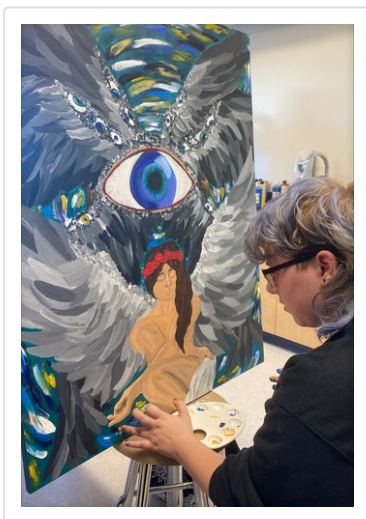

High School Art Exhibition

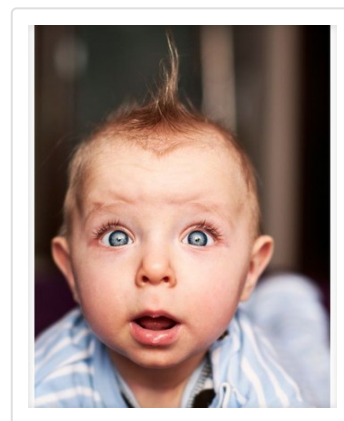

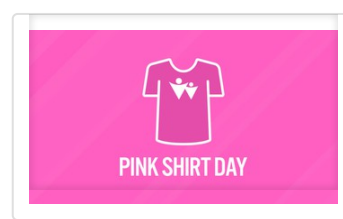

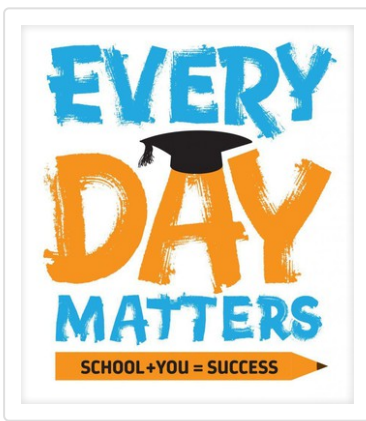

Important Attendance Reminders

- Attendance is monitored and corrected *up until the end of the school day*. Codes for any given day are not final until after 3:30 pm, please do not phone before 3:30 pm unless you are picking up your child or are certain they will not be in school (ex. home sick)
- School trips, school sports, field trips, etc. will be automatically adjusted for all students affected at the end of the day - no need to call.
- If an "A" code is showing for your student *after 3:30pm*, please call the 24-hour attendance line at **403-528-1996 ext. 8** if you would like to excuse your child's absence(s). Excused absences and time in the sick room are still considered as a missed class - and are counted in totals for attendance letters.

School authorities, students, and families share responsibility for ensuring that students attend school. Students with poor attendance in any of their courses will have letters sent to their guardian(s), and attendance contracts put in place and enforced when necessary.

Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students access learning opportunities and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job. Families can also advocate for resources to help students learn if they cannot attend in-person.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Make school attendance a priority

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- Help your teen maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and non-Covid-19 related medical appointments during the school day.
- Keep your student healthy, and if you are concerned about Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- If your teens must stay home because they are sick or in quarantine, make sure they have asked teachers for resources and materials to make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

Help your teen stay engaged

- Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your teens are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor your teen's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Encourage your teen to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- Notice and support your students if they are showing signs of anxiety.

Communicate with the school

- Know the school's attendance policy – incentives and penalties.
- Check on your teen's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.
- Seek help from school staff, other parents or community agencies if you need support.

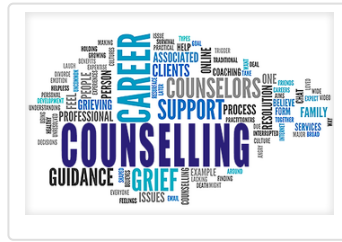
Prairie Rose Public Schools, together with Southland Transportation are looking for bus drivers!
