Social and English exams have two parts. Written components will take place during regular class time, and the second component is scheduled during exam week. Students will get specific information from their teacher.

* Denotes Diploma Exam

Exam Information

- Exams start at 9 AM; please arrive by 8:45am.
- Late arrivals: Students who arrive more than 1 hour late for a Diploma Exam cannot write.
- Minimum stay: All students must remain in the exam room for at least 1 hour after the exam begins.

Rules

- **For all diploma exams, your school-issued Chromebook, fully-charged will be required.**
- Bring an HB pencil to each exam. To Math or Science exams, bring a calculator (will be cleared at the start) with fresh batteries.
- Leave cell phones, watches, and music devices at home, in lockers, or vehicles—they are not allowed in the exam room.
- Only water in a closable container is permitted at desks. No papers, books, or personal notes; Alberta Education paper will be provided if needed.
- Hats, bags, coats, and pencil cases must be left in the designated bleacher area.
- Bathroom breaks require permission and an escort. **Nothing may be taken out of the exam room.**
- No talking or noise during the exam.

Hearts Kindled: Diverse Experiences, Limitless Futures

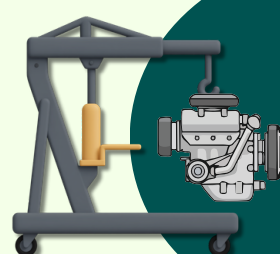


For many of this year's graduates, the moments that shaped them most happened in arenas before sunrise, at work placements where they earned their first paycheques, in barns and hangars, or while learning to lead under pressure alongside teammates and mentors. A few of our graduates were willing to share their reflections on their time at Eagle Butte, and the opportunities that allowed them to step outside their comfort zones and into real-world experiences that prepared them for life beyond high school.

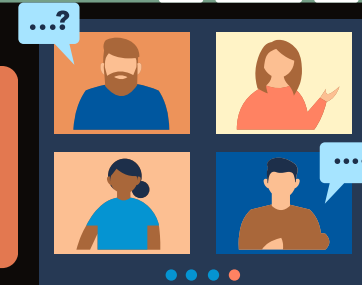

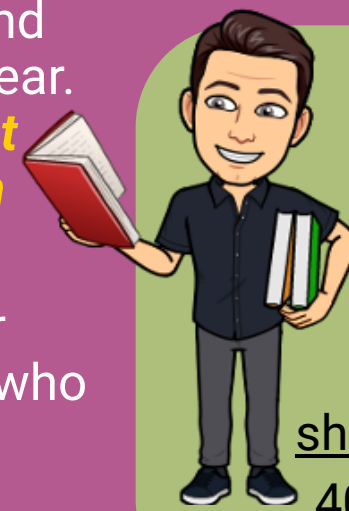
July 17 Time to Talk Scheduling! Is Your Student Set for Success?

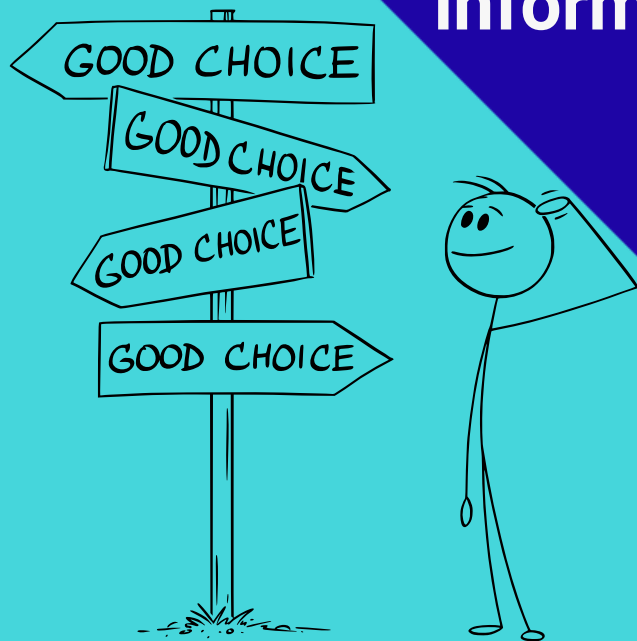

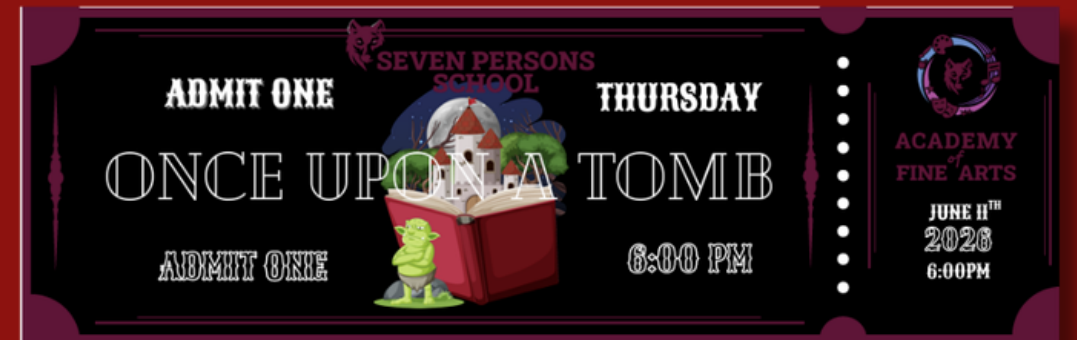
