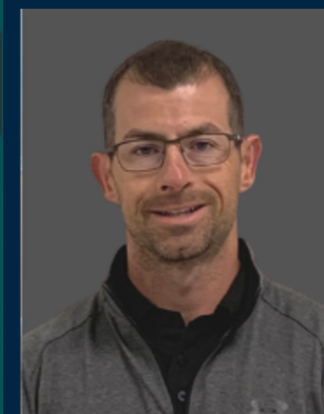

At Eagle Butte High School, we are incredibly proud of our students who recently represented our school at the Skills Competition in Alberta! This was more than just an event - it was an opportunity for students to showcase their abilities, build confidence, and prepare for bright futures in skilled trades.

Venus took 2nd place last year for baking! She is headed back to Skills hoping for first place. "Last year, I made almond cookies, a bread and the competition required me to make a "Cirque-du-Soleil" themed cake all completed in just four hours. I'm going to take on more complex recipes this year." She is challenging herself with French macron cookies in salted caramel flavour, a braided yeast bread and a sponge cake decorated in this year's theme of "harvest".

"I took second again! All my pieces went well. In the end, I wish I had left more time for decorating my cake because this is really my strongest skill, but everything needs to get done for full marks," says Venus. It's not just about the product they put out, they're being inspected throughout for sanitation and no dirty dishes being left in the sink - they have to clean as they go and wipe surfaces continually. Venus said that the first place winner deserved it and had the cutest chicken decoration atop her harvest-themed cake that was so well done!

Luke started building on his farm as soon as he could hold a hammer. He now works alongside his Dad, mainly doing framing but is skilled in many facets of carpentry. Skills is looking for someone whose build is executed with precision and excellence. "I know I'll be asked to build a Lemonade Stand and I know that I get a skill saw, drill, square, chalk line and clamps. I'm most excited about learning more about industry standards."

The carpentry competition challenged all participants beyond their abilities and no one was able to finish the project in the given amount of time, but Luke was the furthest along in his build and judges deemed his work the most skilled - awarding him first place!

Luke tells us he had a lot of fun and enjoyed the day. Luke is proud of his first-place win! He plans to attend Saskatchewan Polytech next year to begin his path to becoming an Electrical Engineer.

"I love Skills and I am excited to be going back!" says Kimiah. She took second place last year and hopes her experience from last year will give her an edge. "We get marked on how our stations are set up and being fully prepared. "We choose our products and wrap them up like little presents so other competitors can't see what we've chosen to use - it's part of the strategy. Last year, I got docked marks for using my lips to hold a bobby pin. A big no-no," she remembers.

In hairstyling, participants have no idea what they'll be asked to recreate until the competition and are provided a photo to replicate as closely as they can. Kimiah didn't place this year, and was very disappointed. But, she said she still had fun and every time it has been a learning experience.

"You learn so much from Skills. I brought my best and I did good work," she says. Kimiah is thankful to have had this opportunity in high school and take away skills she'll use for life!

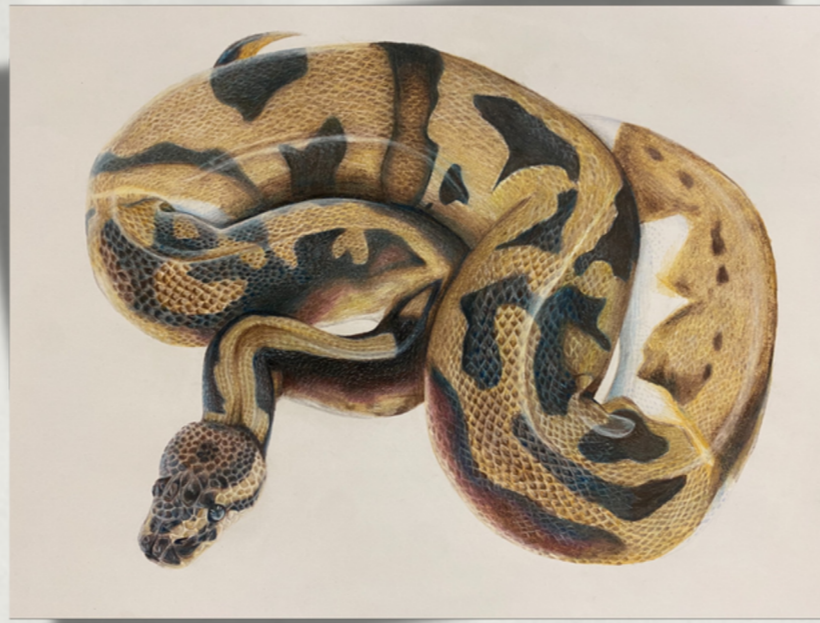

Art class builds real-world skills like creativity, problem-solving, collaboration, and attention to detail.

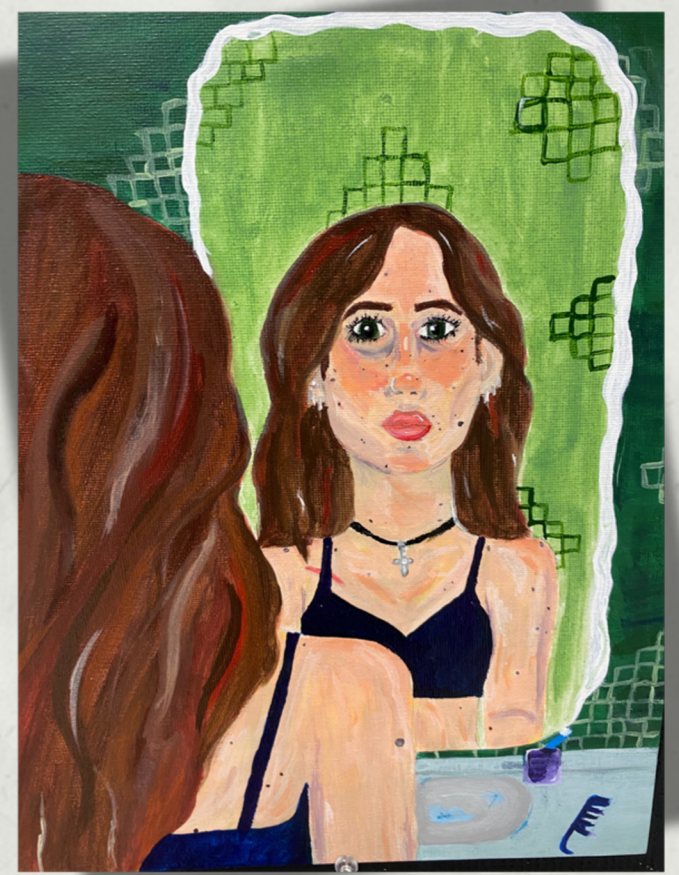

STEM CLASS

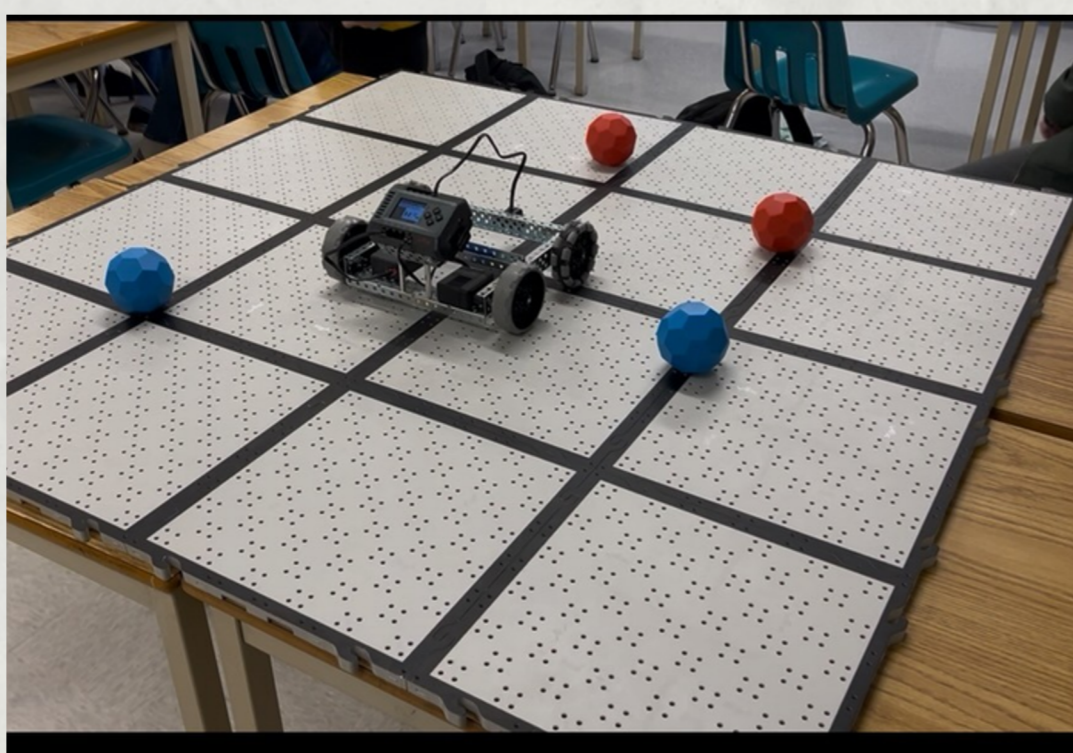


In STEM class, students develop a wide range of technical and analytical skills through hands-on, project-based learning. They gain foundational experience in computer programming and block coding for robotics, which strengthens their logical thinking and problem-solving abilities.

Students have practiced using Geographic Information Systems (GIS)—a powerful tool for capturing, analyzing, and visualizing geographic data. As part of a real-world application, students used drones to collect aerial images in Elkwater and compared them to historical maps to evaluate Lodgepole Pine encroachment.



Through projects like this, students develop critical thinking skills related to data interpretation, environmental analysis, and spatial awareness. These are the same skills used in careers such as urban planning, environmental science, emergency management, and GPS/navigation technology.
