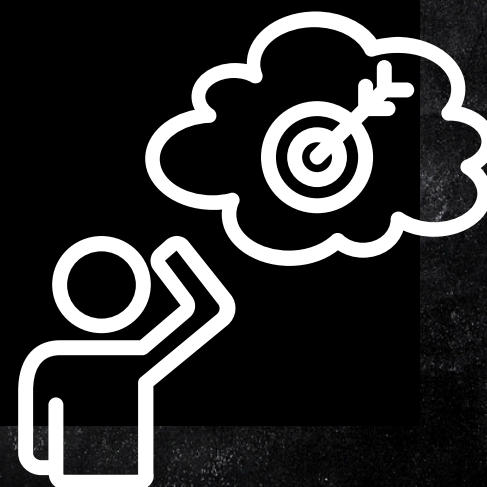

Classroom vibe: A safe, comfortable, inclusive space where everyone can belong.

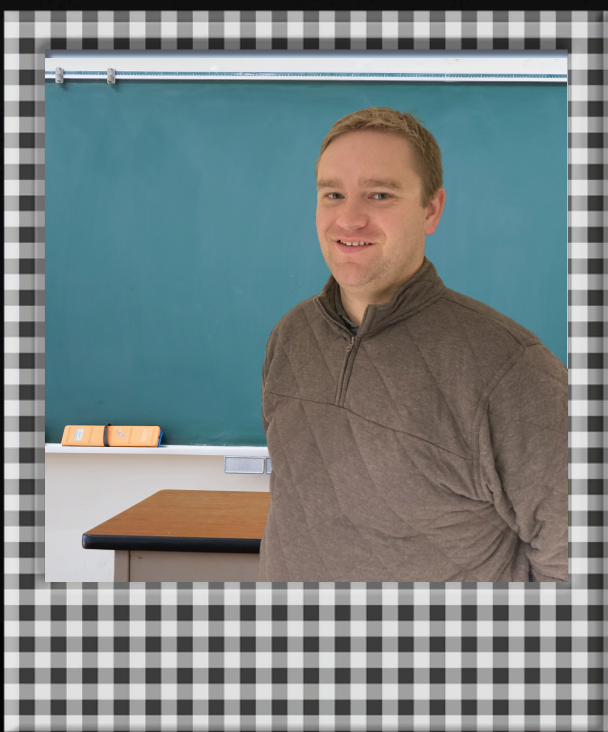


Mrs. Funk, Learning Support Teacher (LST)

Sabrina Kyle, English Teacher - stepping in for Mrs. Jalbert

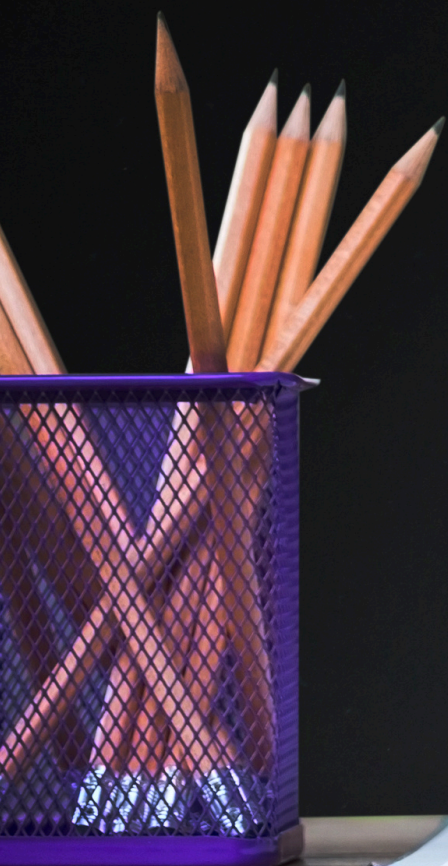

Applications

We encourage students to visit the websites of schools they are considering attending, this will allow them to ask great questions during their meeting with Mr. Wihnan or Mrs. Laturnas.

This can be a great opportunity to tour a school, learn about campus life and meet instructors in programs of interest. SOUTH ALBERTA FIRE RESCUE



South Alberta Fire and Rescue has entered its third year and continues to build momentum in training local students for firefighting careers.

Since its first graduating class, 4 alumni have joined Cypress County Fire, with five more set to begin orientation this October. This year's class has grown to 18 full-time students, the largest yet, with a focus on earning Firefighter Level 1 and 2 certifications over the school year.

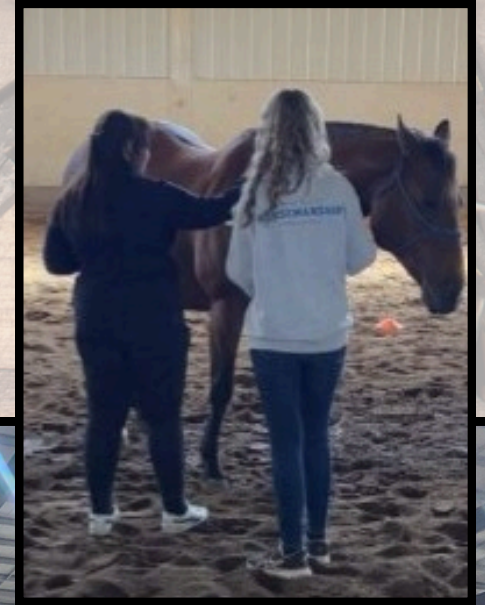
So far this year, students have completed ICS-100, WHMIS, and First Aid/CPR training during a two-day session in Elkwater. With growing enrolment and strong ties to local fire departments, SAFR is quickly becoming a vital pathway from the classroom to active fire services.



HORSEMANSHIP

Horsemanship Academy students have started of the school year strong with two learning and volunteer opportunities. On Saturday September 6th, they gave their day to support the Little Britches rodeo at the Dunmore Equestrian Centre. Then, on Saturday September 13th academy students worked to get the arena ready and volunteered their time on to help host the Chore Team Competition. They spent time learning how to harness teams and understanding the obstacle course that drivers needed to navigate through.

Very recently, we teamed up with our Art 10 and 20 students! Our students showed the horses, using their handling skills to give the Art students opportunity to study and draw horses up close. This unique collaboration was a fun afternoon for both groups of students with a chance to use their learned skills in these courses.

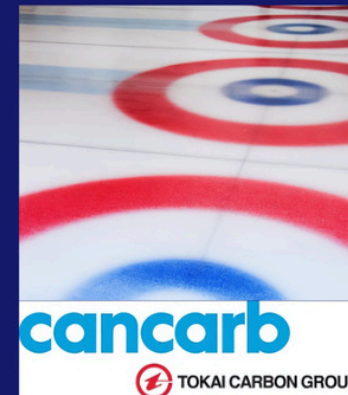

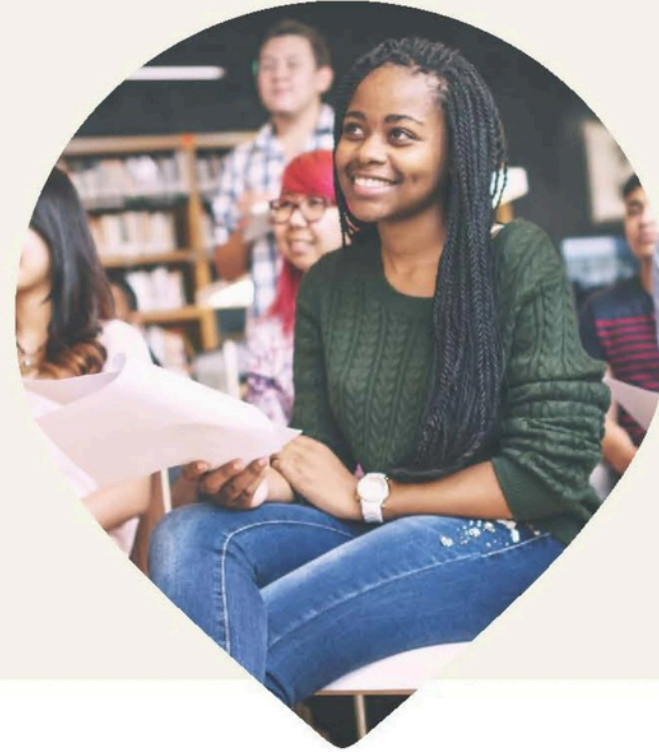

Artificial intelligence is rapidly reshaping the way we work, live, think, and interact. And while young Canadians are some of the most digitally connected people, they remain largely absent from formal decision-making powers. As Canada ramps up its AI strategy, it is essential that youth voices are at the forefront of this conversation—not an afterthought.

This is why we are launching Gen(Z)AI, a youth citizens' assembly on AI.

Between Fall 2025 and Spring 2026, Gen(Z)AI will convene 100 young people, ages 17–23, from across Canada to deliberate on pressing AI issues.

Using a novel citizens' assembly model, participants will engage with leading experts, participate in facilitated discussions, and work together to develop consensus-based policy recommendations about Canada's AI future. The outcomes of each in-person forum will be distributed digitally to thousands more Canadian youth for feedback, before being compiled into a national report. This report will be shared with policymakers, politicians, regulators, and civil society leaders.

This is a unique opportunity for young Canadians to:

- Enhance their critical thinking and deliberation skills;
- Engage directly with experts and thought leaders;
- Gain hands on policymaking experience;
- Make connections and meaningfully collaborate with peers from across Canada.

We would be deeply grateful if you could share this opportunity with your networks and communities to help us reach a representative and diverse group of young Canadians.
