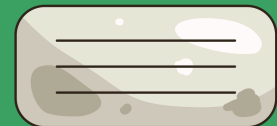

Bringing Clarity and Focus to Learning: 5 In/5 Out

At Eagle Butte High School, we are committed to making learning clear, purposeful, and connected to what comes next for our students. This year, Prairie Rose School Division is implementing the 5 In/5 Out Method™ across our schools, and we are excited about what this means for our classrooms.

The idea is straightforward. In each course, teachers identify five essential skills or outcomes students will develop. By the end of the course, students should be able to clearly explain those five key learnings. Our teachers have been working diligently to identify the most important knowledge and skills in each subject and course. Together,

they assess what outcomes matter most for success in the next course, the next grade, post-secondary pathways, and the workplace. The goal is not to add more to the curriculum, but to place our focus on what truly matters. Lessons and assessments are aligned to the most important outcomes, helping us go deeper into learning rather than trying to cover everything at a surface level.

This approach is especially helpful in high school. Our courses move quickly from semester to semester. 5 In/5 Out gives students a clear target from day one so they know what they are working toward and why it matters. This builds confidence for our students and allows them to take ownership of their learning. They can track their progress, recognize their strengths, and identify areas where they need support. Ideally, learning becomes more focused and manageable.

For families, it creates a simple way to talk about learning at home. We encourage you to ask your student about the five skills they are focusing on in each class. Ask what they feel confident in and what they are still working on. These conversations help students reflect on and reinforce what they are learning, and notice their own growth.

At Eagle Butte High School, we believe clear goals support confident learners. This strategy is one more way we are working to support every student on their path forward.

HELPFUL HINTS

-  At this time you cannot use the PowerSchool app to complete the registration.
-  PowerSchool Enrollment is NOT the same as the PowerSchool Parent Portal. You need a separate account.

Returning PRPS Students

Registration forms will be assigned to all current PRPS students for the 2026-2027 the beginning of February. Families will receive an email from PowerSchool Enrollment with a special code. Each family will be required to make an account when completing their registration forms for the first time using PowerSchool Enrollment.

Step 1: Click the link in the email.

Step 2: Make a new PowerSchool Enrollment account (this is NOT the same as your PowerSchool account).

Step 3: You will be asked to enter your child's birthdate to confirm your identity. The form will be prepopulated and only current changes are required.

New PRPS Student Registrations

If your family is brand new to Prairie Rose Public Schools, you will be required to create a PowerSchool Enrollment account to complete your registration. Only one per family.

Step 2: Choose the form labelled New PRPS Student Registration AND the year 2026-2027. This form will not be available until February 2nd.

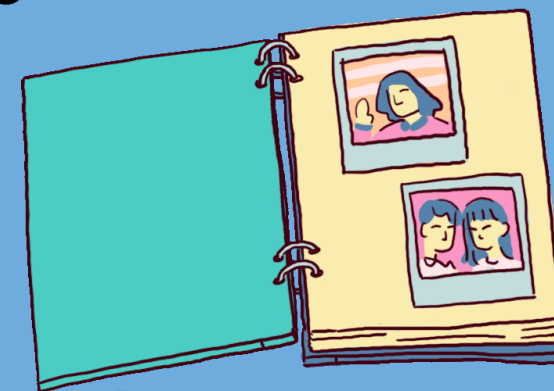

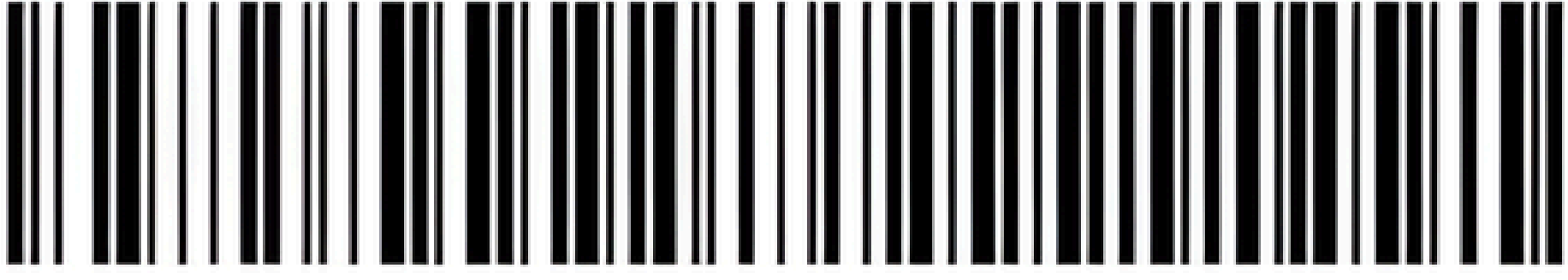

RhPAP organizes these events with the support of local healthcare facilities, providers, and community members.

Community Benefits

- Showcase rural health careers and the scope of practice.
- Strengthen partnerships among schools, providers, and community members.
- Build a pipeline of future rural healthcare professionals.

RhPAP Event Support Includes

- Student transportation (if needed)
- Lunch and snacks
- Volunteer appreciation gifts and swag bags
- Insurance coverage

High School Event Details

Held during school hours at local hospitals, clinics, schools, or community spaces to inspire students to consider careers in rural healthcare and help strengthen the rural workforce pipeline.

Activities include:

- Tours of local healthcare facilities
- Hands-on skills stations (5–40 minutes)
- Q&A sessions with local healthcare providers
- Guest speakers

Planning & Roles

Four key roles with designated leads:

1. **Logistics (RhPAP-led):** Overall coordination and event details.
2. **Healthcare:** Plan and determine skill stations, secure qualified instructors and facility space.
3. **Schools:** Recruit students, manage paperwork, and coordinate transportation.
4. **Community:** Organize swag bags, assist with speakers, and engage local partners.

*Communities must identify and provide the names and email addresses of at least one representative from each of the following areas—Healthcare, Schools, and the Community—who will participate in planning.

Application Details

Preference will be given to communities that have not hosted an RhPAP event in the past three years.

Communities are welcome to apply for both the High School and Post-Secondary Let's Go Rural! events but can only be selected for one per year. (Separate EOIs are required for High School and Post-Secondary events.)

EOIs must be submitted via RhPAP's website; incomplete forms will not be considered.

Successful applicants will be notified by April 30, 2026; others may be waitlisted.

Application deadline: **March 15, 2026**

Redcliff Scholarship for Advanced Education

The Redcliff Scholarship for Advanced Education provides students with up to a maximum \$6,000 per recipient for college or university tuition. The scholarship is awarded every spring. **Application deadline is May 31st annually.**

Scholarship Criteria:

- Available to students attending Eagle Butte High School, Hat High School, McCoy High School, Crescent Height High School or Coulee Collegiate.
- Students must have lived in Redcliff the majority of their school years.
- Students must show proof that they have been accepted and will be attending a post-secondary program in the fall.

The Redcliff Scholarships for Advanced Education will provide **a total of three \$6,000** scholarships to successful applicants who currently live in Redcliff, or have lived in the community for the majority of their school years. Awards are for tuition at a university, college or technical institute. Criteria include a preference for first year post-secondary students, financial need, leadership and academic merit.

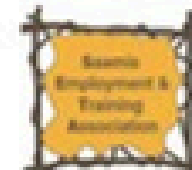

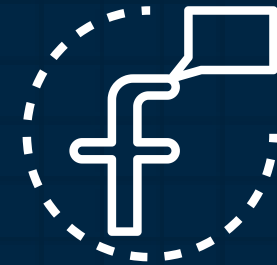
