Forging Futures: New High School Trades Programming and Off Campus Opportunities

Opportunities Abound for Students

This is such an exciting time to be in education! Students and parents alike are keen to see employable skills and work readiness learning incorporated into the school day, and we have many opportunities to offer at EBHS. We recently announced our new School of Trades program and the response was overwhelming - the available spots are already full. In partnership with Medicine Hat College, students will get hands-on training and classroom instruction. They can choose from various trades and discover their passions, setting them on a path towards rewarding careers in any of the following industries:

- ✳ Steam and Power (steamfitter/pipefitter and power engineering)
- ✳ Transportation (automotive service tech, heavy equipment service tech)
- ✳ Construction 'A' (carpentry and welding)
- ✳ Construction 'B' (plumbing and electrical)



We recognize that each student has unique talents, interests, and aspirations, and it is our aim to provide them with a range of opportunities to thrive and succeed. Through our Off Campus Office, we are proud to partner with the **Alberta Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP)** and the **Alberta Green Certificate Program** to give students relevant and unique learning experiences.

We currently have our highest enrollment ever in each of these programs. Interest in our Green Certificate programming has exploded this year! In years past, only two to four students made use of this incredible program – we now have 28 students working on Green Certificates and many of those working towards their second Certificate. Incredible! Students can enroll in Green Certificate at any point in the school year and work on them throughout their entire high school career. Each of these programs offer valuable opportunities for students to gain real-world experience and industry-recognized certifications, giving them a competitive edge in today's job market.

Another amazing opportunity is our **Work Experience Program**. This is open to any student who will complete a minimum 75 hours in a paid job, as a community volunteer, or working on their family farms and ranches. We currently have 120 students per summer enroll in this program. Looking for work? Check out the job board in the Science wing.

In addition to the valuable learning and skills gained through any of the above programs, students also have the potential to earn a significant number of high school credits. For our students who are aiming to graduate with a teal cord at 140 credits, this is a great way to help achieve that goal!

The success of these programs depends on the support and involvement of our community partners. If you own a business and could offer a RAP placement or job opportunity, call us first! We want to match you with a student. Parents involved with agriculture, we need you as leaders in industry to become testers that can help us run testing dates for our Green Certificate students. This process is not complicated, and we would love to have you involved! Training and a stipend are provided for our testers. This year we held three test dates at EBHS to accommodate our students.

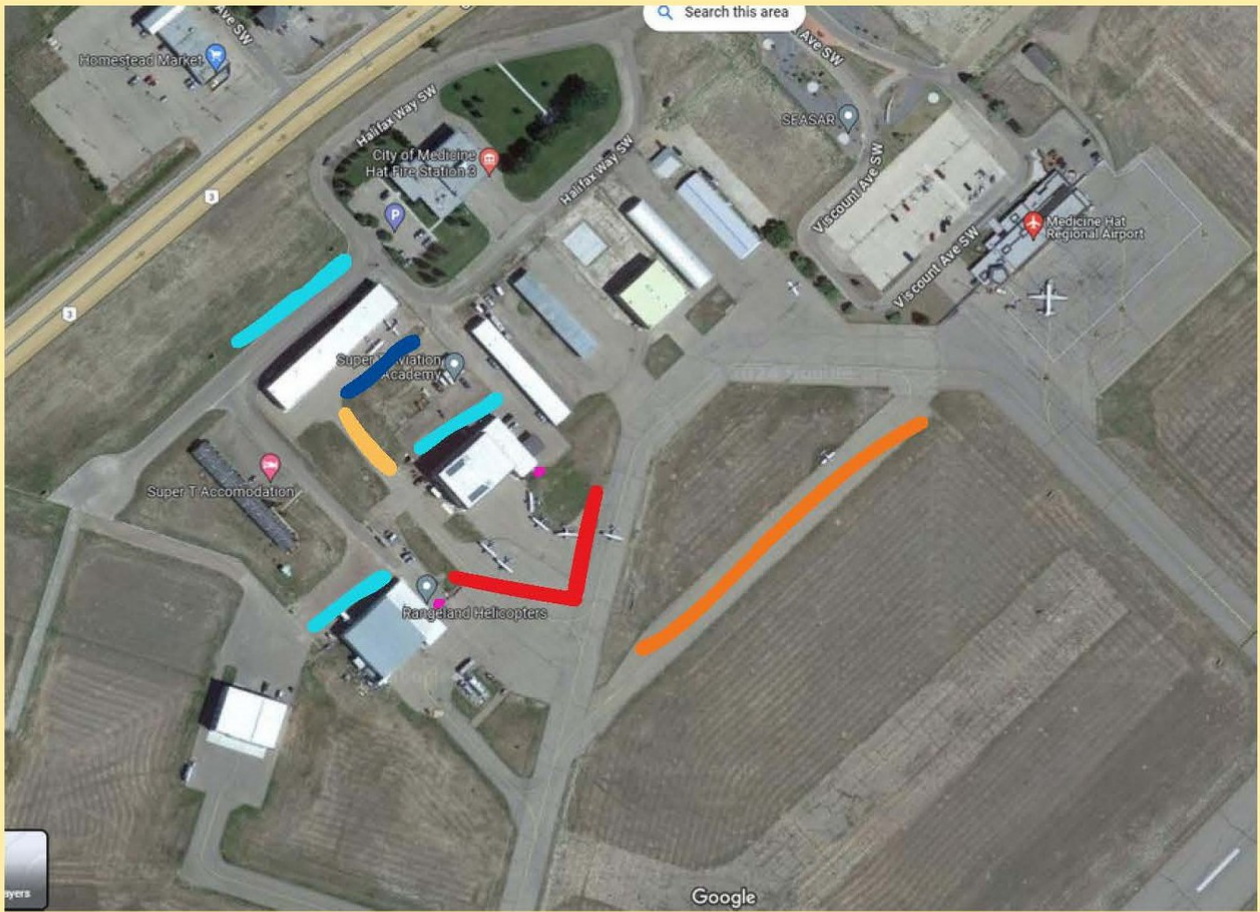

Teachers will deliver live lessons during class time; students can choose to **learn at home through Google Meet, or in person.**

RECOMMENDATIONS/EXPECTATIONS

JUNIOR HIGH PROGRAMS

These courses are for students who want to improve their knowledge of the basic concepts in a particular subject. There are limited spaces in these classes so early register is recommended.

SENIOR HIGH PROGRAMS

High school courses will be offered to those students who want to: upgrade existing marks, complete pre-requisite courses, and/or fast-track their high school program.

FEES (PER COURSE)

Junior high students: \$130
High school students: \$60
Adults: \$600
International students: \$1,200

ATTENDANCE/WORKLOAD

These courses come with a heavy work load, including daily homework assignments and less time for completion. Virtual classes will have mandatory daily attendance. A class period (2 hours for junior high and 3.25 hours for high school) is equivalent to approximately 1 week of regular classes. Due to the compressed nature of our program, the following rules apply:

- Students will be withdrawn from classes **after 3 absences.**
- If students miss class due to illness, they must contact the teacher and arrange to catch up outside of class.
- **DO NOT register for Summer School if you know you must miss some classes.**



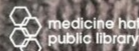

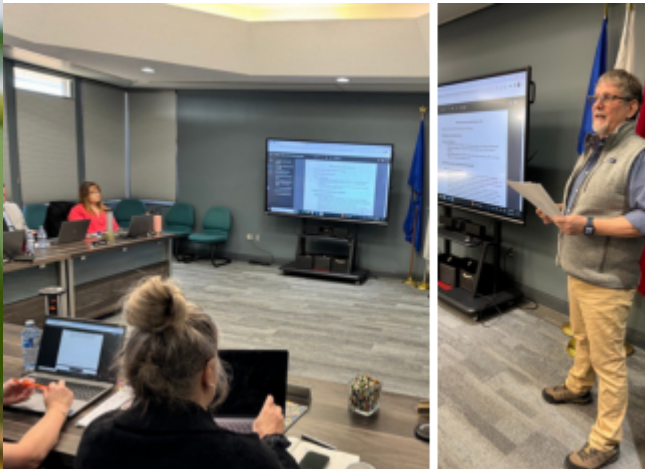
