

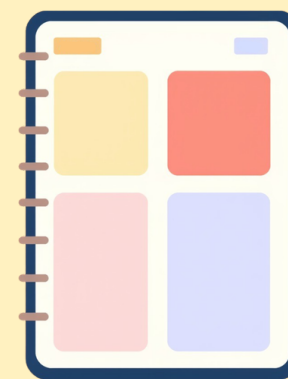

# Keep Showing Up for Yourself & Sharpen those Study Skills



As we head into the last full month of school and final evaluations and exams are coming closer, it is so important to keep showing up for yourself every day and doing the important work of review. By now, you have been given a lot of content and skills, and how you study these can make a significant difference to your final few weeks of the semester. Here's the truth: many of the study habits you think are working, might actually be holding you back.

## The Myths We Need to Leave Behind



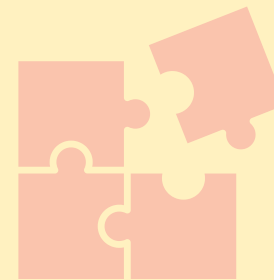
**Myth #1: Re-reading your notes is studying.** It feels productive, but your brain isn't really working hard. You're just recognizing information, not learning it.

**Myth #2: Highlighting everything important helps you remember.** A page full of yellow highlighter looks impressive, but it doesn't push your brain to actually process what matters.

**Myth #3: Studying one subject for hours straight is the best approach.** Long blocks on a single topic can trick you into thinking you have mastered it when you haven't.

These habits feel comfortable, but that is exactly the problem. Real learning happens when your brain has to struggle a little. Scientists call this *cognitive friction*. When studying feels easy, you're probably not learning much. When it feels challenging, that's when your brain is building stronger memories.

## Three Study Strategies That Actually Work



### 1. Practice Pulling Information Out of Your Brain (Active Retrieval)

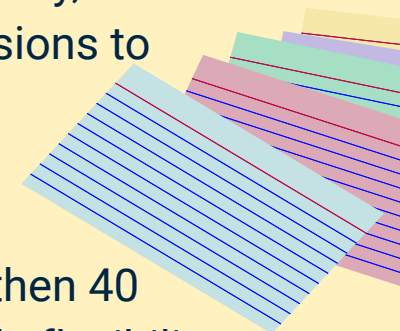
Instead of reading your notes over and over, close them and try to write down everything you remember. Use flashcards. Quiz yourself. Ask a friend to test you. **Why it works:** Every time you force your brain to retrieve information, you strengthen the pathway to that memory. It's like building a muscle – the effort is what makes it stronger.

### 2. Spread Out Your Studying (Spacing)

Don't cram everything the night before. Study a little bit over several days. Review your math notes on Monday, come back to them on Wednesday, and again on Friday. **Why it works:** Your brain needs time between study sessions to consolidate what you've learned. Spacing things out helps information stick in your long-term memory.

### 3. Mix Up Your Subjects (Interleaving)

Instead of spending two hours straight on science, try 40 minutes of science, then 40 minutes of English, then 40 minutes of math. **Why it works:** Switching between subjects forces your brain to keep adjusting. This builds flexibility and helps you recognize which strategy to use for different types of problems. This is a skill you will use when taking your exams.



## Own Your Learning

This year, as a staff we have upped our commitment to helping students make a big shift: from simply doing the work to owning the learning. Doing the work means completing assignments to get them done. Owning the learning means understanding why you're doing something and how it helps you grow.

Part of owning your learning is developing metacognition, which is just a fancy word for **thinking about your thinking**. Ask yourself questions like:

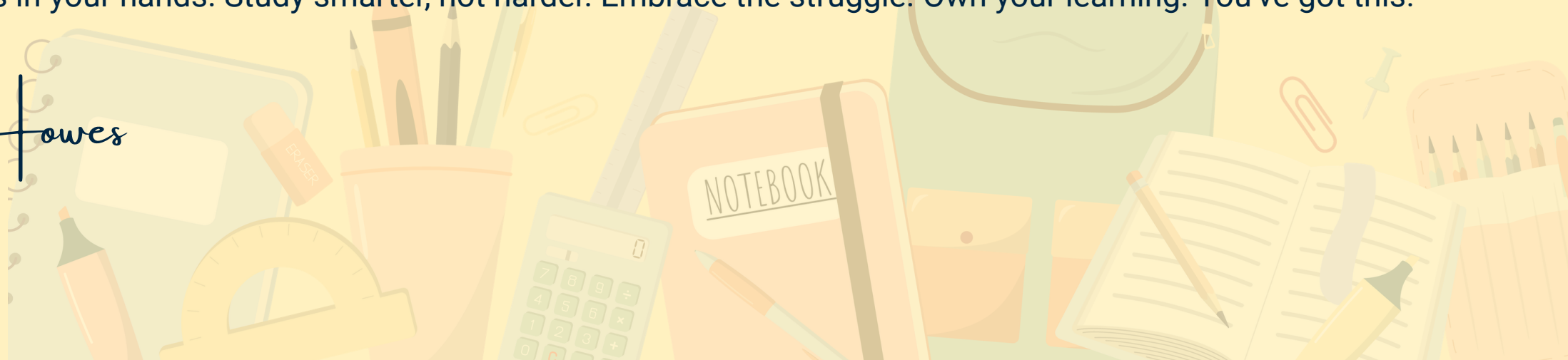
- Do I actually understand this, or am I just familiar with it?
- What's confusing me, and what can I do about it?
- Which study strategies are working for me, and which ones aren't?



When you start asking these questions, you take control of your own learning. And these are skills that will serve you far beyond any exam. As your teachers work hard to prepare you for finals and help you build these skills, remember that the real power is in your hands. Study smarter, not harder. Embrace the struggle. Own your learning. You've got this!

### HELPFUL HINTS

- ✘ At this time you cannot use the PowerSchool app to complete the registration.
- ✘ PowerSchool Enrollment is NOT the same as the PowerSchool Parent Portal. You need a separate account.

### Returning PRPS Students

Registration forms will be assigned to all current PRPS students for the 2026-2027 the beginning of February. Families will receive an email from PowerSchool Enrollment with a special code. Each family will be required to make an account when completing their registration forms for the first time using PowerSchool Enrollment.

**Step 1:** Click the link in the email.

**Step 2:** Make a new PowerSchool Enrollment account (this is NOT the same as your PowerSchool account).

**Step 3:** You will be asked to enter your child's birthdate to confirm your identity. The form will be prepopulated and only current changes are required.

### New PRPS Student Registrations

If your family is brand new to Prairie Rose Public Schools, you will be required to create a PowerSchool Enrollment account to complete your registration. Only one per family.

**Step 2:** Choose the form labelled New PRPS Student Registration AND the year 2026-2027. This form will not be available until February 2nd.

# More Than Attendance: Forging Your Future

There is a unique energy in our hallways when every desk is filled and every voice is heard. If you are having a hard time getting to school, it may help you to look at the list of “**Root Causes**” below and try to identify what are the barriers standing in your way.

## The Heart of the Matter

It's a common misconception that missing a day here or there doesn't change much. But missing 1 or 2 days a month is 20 days a year, or a whole month of the school year. This creates significant learning gaps. **Whether an absence is excused or unexcused, the "learning loss" is the same.** Being here isn't about perfect records; it's about continued success in school and building the bridge to the person you want to become.

## Unlock the Life You Deserve

Earning your Alberta High School Diploma is one of the most significant gifts you can give your future self. It is the "key" to so many doors:

- **Financial Freedom:** High school graduates in Canada earn significantly more income over their lifetime.
- **Stability & Peace of Mind:** Lower unemployment rates and better access to steady work and health benefits.
- **Open Doors:** Whether it's a college program, university, or vocational school, your diploma is the foundation that makes those dreams possible.

## You Belong Here

Our school isn't the same without you. When you show up, you contribute to our culture and help those around you grow. And, you are building a habit of "showing up" that will serve you for the rest of your life. Your future is bright! 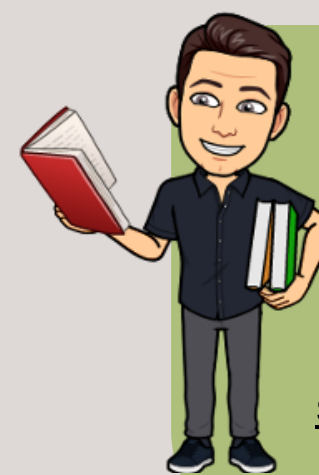

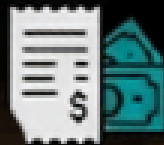
