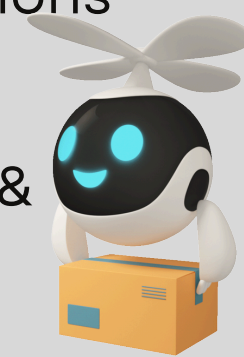
Unlock Your Potential with **STEM** Opportunities at EBHS

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) has become a buzz word in education but for good reason - STEM education teaches students to think critically and solve real world problems. At EBHS, we have awesome opportunities for students who like to engage with how the world works and develop understanding through exploration. STEM-related careers are in high demand and often come with competitive salaries. Everything from the cars we drive to the medicine we take comes from STEM-related jobs. Here are a few ways that can gain exposure to STEM careers at Eagle Butte:

- 1. STEM Option Class** – This class is a chance to dive into tech projects and hands-on learning. If your child has any interest in computer programming or robotics programming, our STEM option class is one to put on your radar! Students in this class are using JavaScript and Python as well as block coding for robotics. They have also had an intro to Geographic Information System (GIS) which is the technology used to capture, analyse, and visualize spatial or geographic data. Students have captured drone images in Elkwater to compare to historical maps to assess the Lodgepole Pine encroachment in the area. Skills like this are used in jobs like urban planning, environmental science, emergency management, navigation and GPS.
 - 2. STEM for a Day at Medicine Hat College** – On May 6th, EBHS will take the first 20 kids to sign up and return the necessary forms to this one-day immersive event. Invited by the Medicine Hat College, we have just 20 spots up for grabs. It is a chance to explore STEM related programs, specifically University Transfer Science, Power Engineering and Built Environment Engineering Technology. More details can be found below in this newsletter.
 - 3. Learn to Fly Drones** – Students can sign up to learn drone flight while attending our school. Drones are used in agriculture, photography, engineering, defence and more. You do not need any experience to get started, and there are lots of different classes offered from a basic license to specialty courses. You can check out all we offer in this [Drone Program Booklet](#).

This year, our Flight Academy students will reinforce their learning by becoming hosts and teachers at **Drone Expo on May 26**. PRPS students in grade 6-9 will be able to come to this event and visit various stations manned by our students who are already trained in drone flight.

Participants can participate in stations such as Altitude Challenge & Photography, Racing & Technical Skills, Movie Shots, Landing Zone Accuracy, Mini Drone Racing and more!



All of these opportunities are designed to spark curiosity, build real skills, and set our students up for success in the future. Are you ready to explore, innovate, or maybe just try something new?

In addition to students participating in activities for each of these program areas, they will also get to go for a campus tour, fill their bellies with a free pizza lunch and end the day with a friendly scavenger hunt competition with some awesome prizes.

CF Industries will be sponsoring the event again this year, which means that **the cost of bussing, session materials, lunch, snacks, and swag is all provided to the students!**

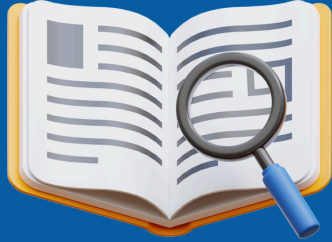

Spotlight on Career & Technology Studies



FOODS

Building essential life and career skills, students in Food Studies are creating, problem-solving, and adapting to challenges daily.



In our Food Studies classes, students are gaining experience in food safety, sanitization, measuring, knife skills, basic math, and reading comprehension. Students problem solve, communicate with their teams, and organize themselves to be successful - all while managing their time and working efficiently with safety front of mind.

Throughout the semester students will progress through 6 credits, each credit will focus on specific skills needed to create anything from a basic salad to a complex layered cake. Students first learn the **“why”** through theory so they can create a product successfully and to the best of their abilities.

Foods 10 will soon be focusing on food costing and budgeting. These skills will transfer into their future lives as they head out on their own for the first time. Students will learn how to meal plan, how to create dishes within a set budget, ways to save at the grocery store, and how to price items to ensure they are getting the best deal allowing their dollar to stretch further.

Ultimately, Food Studies students are gaining essential life skills within the classroom that will transfer to their future lives as they navigate their independence. Students will have the skills to sustain themselves and cook nutritious meals while being budget conscious.



COSMETOLOGY

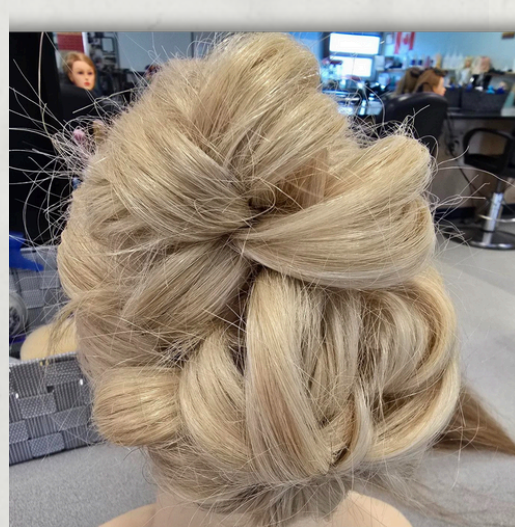


In Cosmetology, students are practicing for our Alberta Skills Competition which is scheduled for April 11. For this competition, students will be performing an updo and applying the knowledge and skills they have learned in the classroom.

Judges from various Salons throughout the city will meticulously assess each design. This competition provides exposure to professionals in the field and helps students gain perspective on potential career opportunities.



In Cosmetology 10, the students are learning how to do a basic perm wrap on their mannequins. Students will learn how to incorporate various sized perming rods. While implementing this skill, sectioning is imperative.

EARN CREDITS

Work Experience Credit Opportunity

Work Experience contracts are now available in the **Off-Campus Office!** If you have a part-time job or plan to work over the summer, you may be eligible to earn credits toward graduation. Students can qualify if they:

- ✓ Work on a family farm or ranch
- ✓ Have a part-time or full-time job
- ✓ Volunteer at an organization

To be eligible, you must work a minimum of 75 hrs from May 1-August 30. Stop by the Off-Campus Office to pick up your contract and start earning credits for your work! Maximum of 10 credits per year (250 hours). Many students who participate in Summer Work Experience earn Teal Cord (140 Credits) at graduation.

CERTIFICATE
Agricultural Training

Green Certificate is an agricultural hands-on learning opportunity that offer up to 16, 30-level credits for students that are active on their family's farm or ranch. Courses are completed at home and testing is held at EBHS. Students can start at any time throughout the year.

How It Works:

- Sign Up and complete a safety course.
- Students complete hands-on course materials from home at their own pace
- Testing is done at EBHS throughout the school year.
- Students can begin the program at any time during the year and complete the course throughout their high school years.

Returning Prairie Rose Student Registrations

All current PRPS students have been issued a Returning Student Registration form. These forms are now due for the 2025-2026 school year. To access these forms you must log in to your [PowerSchool Parent Portal account Parent Sign In \(prsd8.ca\)](https://prsd8.ca) to complete the registration.

➔ Username for your account is your email on file with the school division. The password is something you would have chosen. If you don't remember your password choose the 'Forgot Password' option to reset it. Any issues with logging into your parent account can be directed to your school administrative assistant or by emailing kristalester@prrd8.ca.

➔ Once you are logged in, look for the School Engage icon on the left side of your screen. Click this option and it will move you into a new School Engage portal with a list of your registered students.

➔ If you are also planning to enrol your child in an academy program or they require bus transportation, additional forms will be assigned to you (through School Engage or via email) upon completion of the pre-enrolment form.

Helpful Hint 📝: It is optimal to complete the forms on a laptop, computer or Chromebook as the menu bar where School Engage is located will automatically open.

Helpful Hint 📝: If you are doing it on a phone, you cannot use the PowerSchool app. It has to be a browser such as Safari or Google. Once you log into PowerSchool look for the small arrow in the grey area on the left side of the screen under your child's name. You will need to expand this to find School Engage.

In order for us to arrange course choices for your student for next year, we will need a completed registration to confirm your student is attending. Course selections will NOT be confirmed until a completed registration is received. This is also a requirement for Alberta Education for student record regulation. Please complete this very important documentation ASAP following the instructions above.

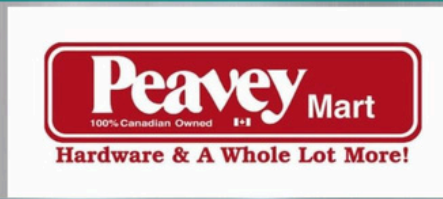

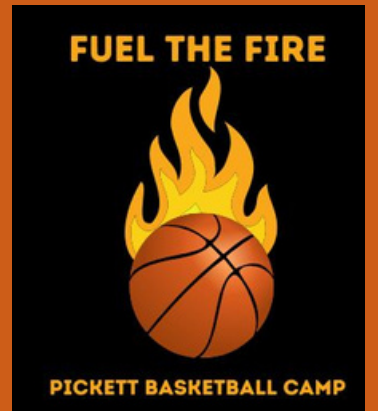

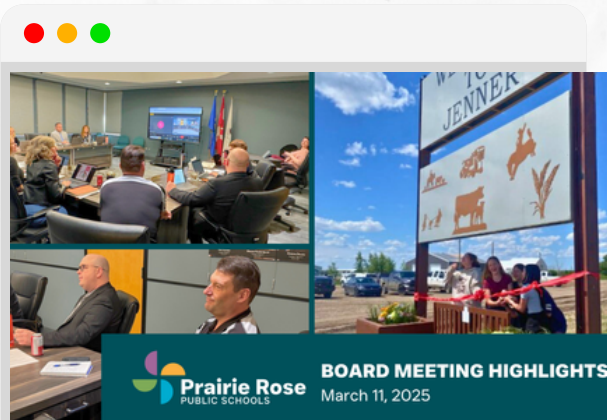
