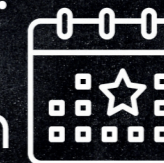

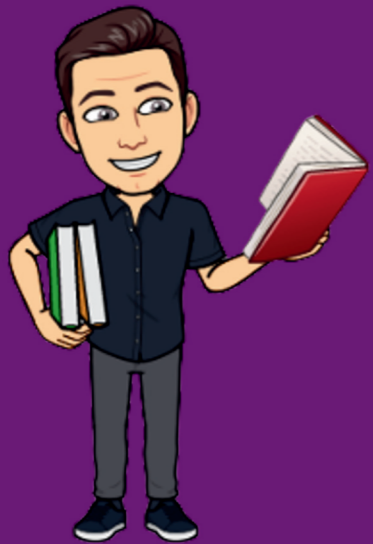

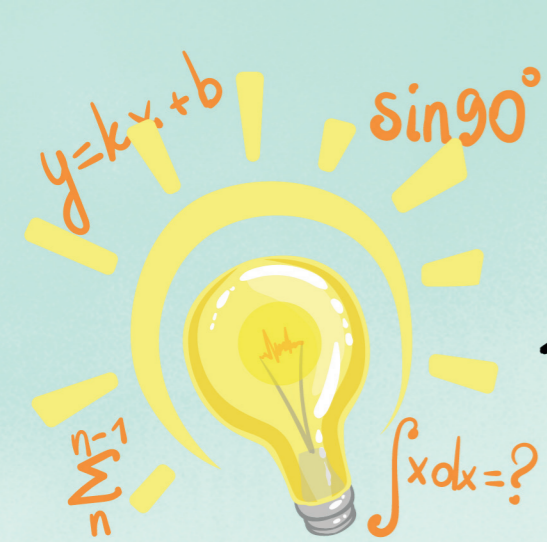

Course Correct: Planning Today for Tomorrow's Triumphs



I have never had a student say to me yet that they thought Math 10 Prep was a waste of time and they wish they hadn't taken the class. In fact, the feedback is usually that they're so thankful for this course and being given the tools to succeed.

I have the great privilege of teaching high school math at Eagle Butte High School. As we wrap up this semester and this school year, I feel that this year has given me deeper insights into the needs of my students and their struggles and successes along the way.

You are probably already aware that in Alberta, the Grade 9 Mathematics Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) serves as one of the key indicators of student proficiency in mathematics. According to the latest available data, a little more than one-third of students did not meet the acceptable standard of learning outcomes on this PAT exam. This data highlights the need for additional support in building a strong foundation in math. And the great news is, we have a solution!

Math 10 Prep is a course designed specifically for students coming into high school who may need to refresh and reinforce essential math skills and concepts before moving on to more advanced high school mathematics courses. We work through the essential building blocks of the Math 10C curriculum at a slower pace, reviewing concepts as needed by individual students. Students enter Math 10C in second semester with a strong foundation, ready to meet the challenge and quicker pace of Math 10C.

Why consider Math 10 Prep?

Students who begin with Math 10 Prep are more likely to experience confidence and long-term success in high school math. This course provides the time and support to solidify core concepts before being swept up into new and more complex Math curriculum.

Students may benefit from Math 10 Prep if they:

- earned below 65% in Grade 9 Math
- struggled with number sense, algebra, or problem-solving.
- require additional time to build math confidence and study skills.
- have inconsistent attendance or gaps in their math learning.
- plan to take Math 10C but would benefit from a supported transition.

Let me be very clear that choosing Math 10 Prep is not a step back! Instead, it is a wise and strategic step forward for students who would say yes to any of the criteria above. I have had many students in 10C say that they wish they had taken 10 Prep. I have never had a student who took 10 Prep say that they wished they had not.

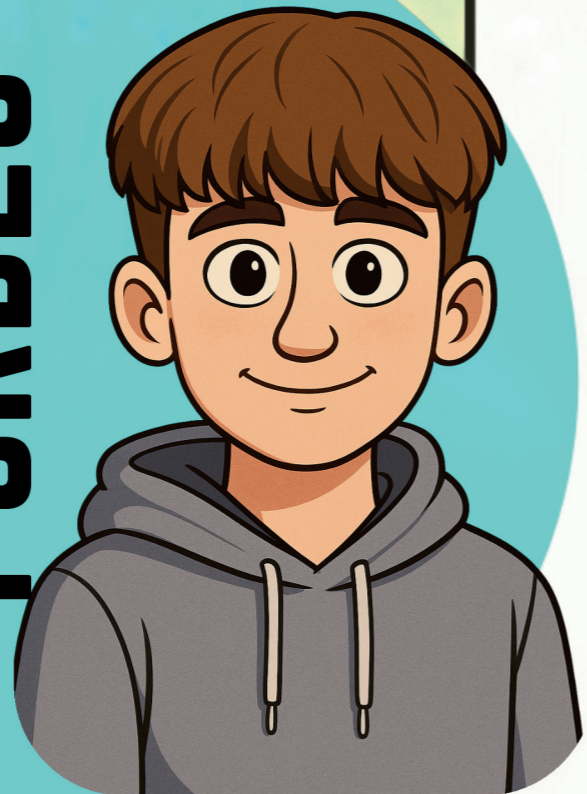
My colleagues and I share the hope that every student feels capable, supported, and successful in their courses. It is wise to reach out to your students' academic counsellor at Eagle Butte if you think your student may benefit from Math 10 Prep, so they can create an appropriate timetable for your student.

I am excited to welcome our Grade 10 students in September! Best of luck to all students as they wrap up this school year and write their exams this month.

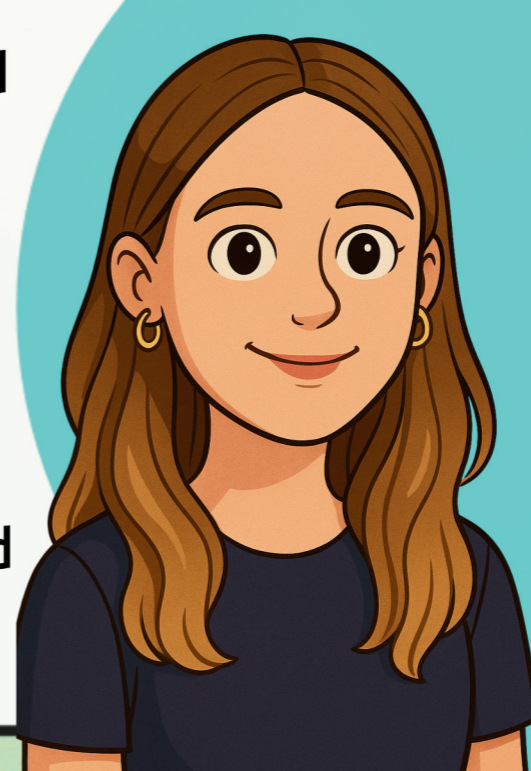

It is a very, very big jump from Math 9 to Math 10C. I decided on my own to take Math 10 Prep in the first semester, and I am so glad I did. I've already told my younger sister to plan on doing the same. When you know that your core subjects aren't optional, you have to set yourself up to succeed. Math has always been a challenge for me and I don't enjoy it but I know I need it to get to where I want to go. Without Math 10 Prep, I'm not sure I would've passed the Polynomials unit or the Slope units in 10C. I have no regrets and Math 10C has gone great this semester!



I have been tutored in Math since Grade 8 and it was my tutor who recommended I do Math Prep when I got to Grade 10. I'm so glad I did. It would have been so much more stressful to jump into 10C without Prep. I don't think I would've known what I was doing without it. Even Math Prep felt difficult, and my grade at the end wasn't high, but now, because of what I learned, I'm doing 11% better in Math 10C than even what I earned in Math Prep. My friends and I from Math Prep all said how thankful we were to have taken the class.

EXAMS



Students only attend school on the day of their exams, according to the schedule below

Please read all the instructions and regulations for exams below. Arrive by 8:45am and come prepared. Thank you.

Instructions & Rules

Exam Information

- Exams start at 9 AM; please arrive at least 15 minutes early.
- Late arrivals: Students who arrive more than 1 hour late for a Diploma Exam cannot write.
- Minimum stay: All students must remain in the exam room for at least 1 hour after the exam begins.

Rules

- Bring an HB pencil to each exam. To Math or Science exams, bring a calculator (will be cleared at the start) with fresh batteries. For English/Social exams, your school-issued Chromebook, fully-charged will be required for the written portion of your exam.
- Leave cell phones, watches, and music devices at home, in lockers, or vehicles—they are not allowed in the exam room.
- Only water in a closable container is permitted at desks. No papers, books, or personal notes; Alberta Education paper will be provided if needed.
- Hats, bags, coats, and pencil cases must be left in the designated bleacher area.
- Bathroom breaks require permission and an escort. Nothing may be taken out of the exam room.
- No talking or noise during the exam.

Tips for Success

- Set an alarm to ensure you are on time.
- Eat a good meal before your exam.
- Arrange transportation in advance if not using regular bus times.

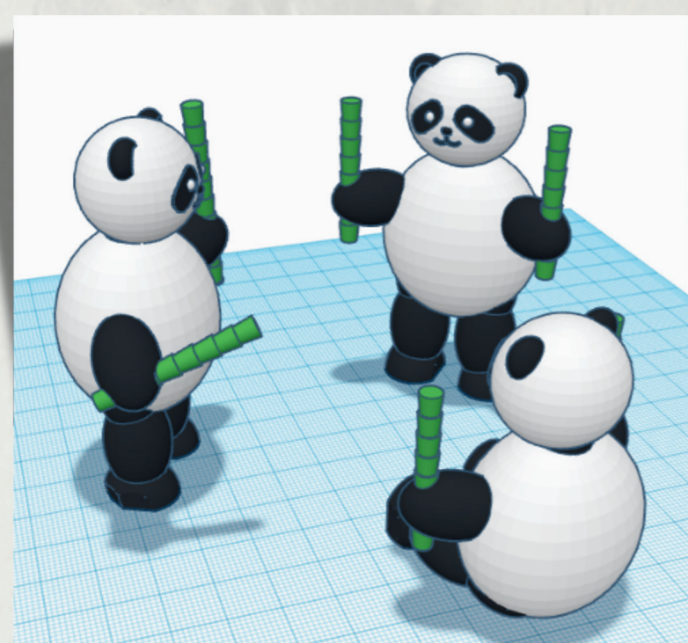

Spotlight on Career & Technology Studies



DESIGN STUDIES 10/20/30

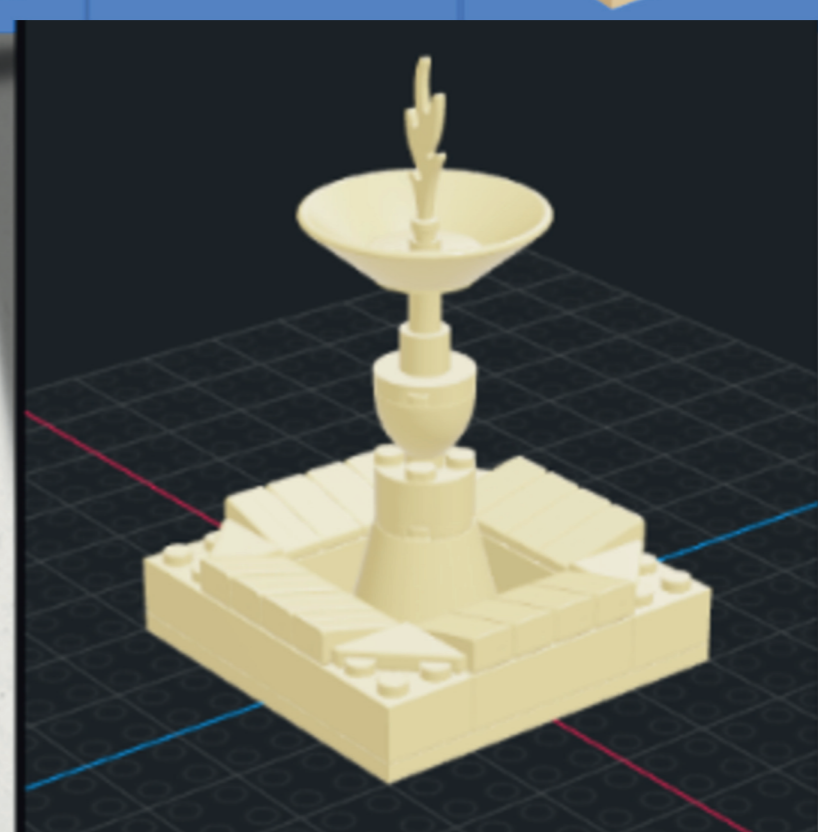
Students explore the creative and technical processes of design, through hands-on projects in areas like architecture, graphic design, and product development.



In Design Studies 10/20/30, students explore the world of modern design using digital tools and technology. Through hands-on projects, they learn to create logos, architectural plans, and product designs using professional software. The course emphasizes creative problem-solving and helps students develop real-world skills in graphic design, architecture, and product development.



A highlight of the course is our TinkerCAD unit, where students dive into 3D modeling and printing. They design their own 3D objects, learning about scale, structure, and functionality, then bring their creations to life using a 3D printer. From digital concepts to physical models, students gain a deeper understanding of the design process while exploring the exciting possibilities of technology.



FINANCE

Equips students with practical knowledge and skills in money management, budgeting, saving, investing, and understanding personal and global financial systems.



EXAMPLE OF STUDENT WORK

SAVING AND INVESTING MONEY

1 SAVING TIPS

- Limit eating out
- Limit impulse purchases
- Buy what you need, not want
- Reduce subscriptions
- Pay yourself first - put money into a savings account

2 TFSA

A TFSA is a tax free savings account, meaning you don't have to pay any taxes on the money that you have in it. The maximum amount of money you can have in it is \$7,000.

3 TYPE OF INVESTMENTS

- Stocks
- Mutual funds
- Bonds
- GIC's (guaranteed investment certificate)

4 RULE OF 72

The rule of 72 calculates how long it will take for your money to double. To figure it out, you divide 72 by the interest rate and your answer is how long it takes.

5 COMPOUND INTEREST

Putting money into a savings account is highly beneficial, especially when you gain compound interest on that money. Compound interest makes your money exponentially grow by earning interest on already earned interest plus the money that was originally in the account.

In Finance class, we learn about:

- Practical financial topics such as bank accounts, budgeting, saving, investing, compound interest, and borrowing money.
- Tax-Free Savings Accounts (TFSAs), Registered Retirement Savings Plans (RRSPs)
- The responsible use of credit cards
- Effective money management strategies.
- How to get the books started for a new business: financial accounting, the accounting cycle for service businesses, preparation of financial statements, and mastering accounting procedures.

The goal is to build confidence, critical thinking, and a sense of financial responsibility that will serve students well beyond the classroom. Students engage in projects and discussions that help them apply financial concepts in meaningful ways—whether it's creating a personal budget, evaluating investment options, or setting up the financial records for a small business.

To prepare students for the 21st century, it's essential to equip them with financial skills for responsible decision-making. Financial literacy is key to personal and professional success, helping students navigate the complexities of modern economic life. Teaching Financial Management in high school empowers students to make informed decisions, setting the foundation for successful futures.

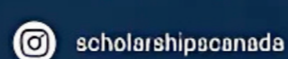

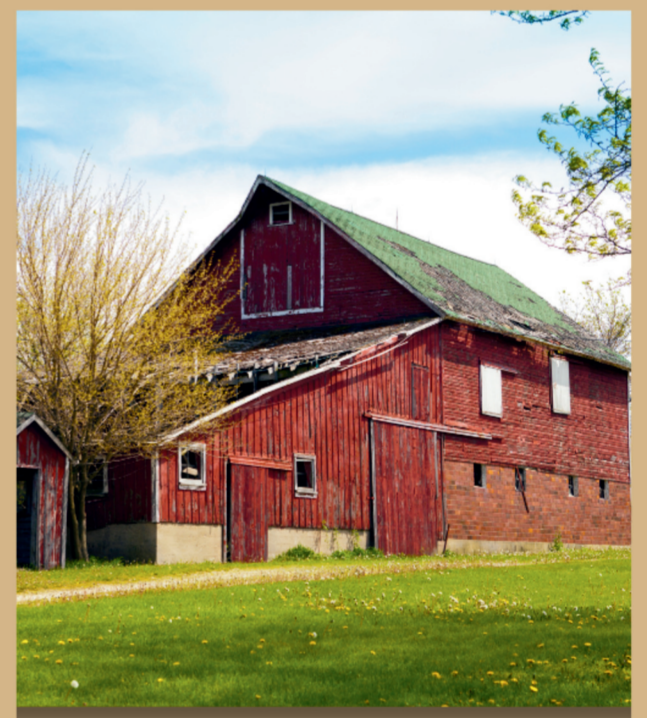

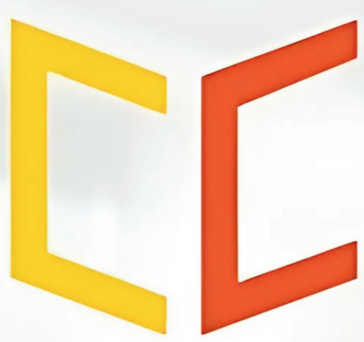

Students are encouraged to come to class on test days.

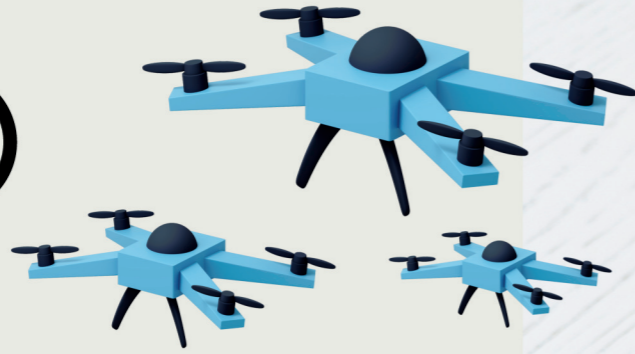

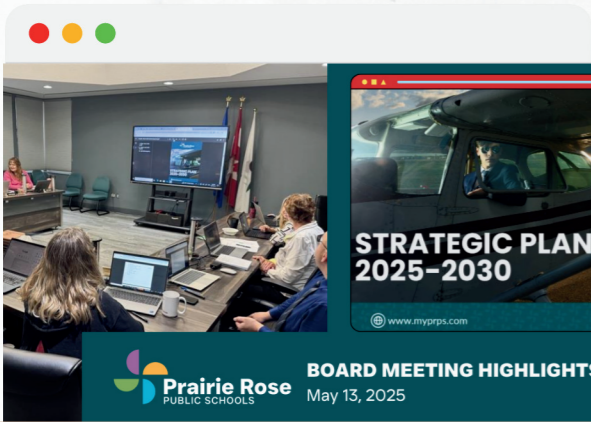
